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Patrick Bond is Distinguished Professor of Political Economy at the University of the Witwatersrand in Johannesburg. He authored several books on the Bretton Woods Institutions' influence in South Africa, Zimbabwe and the African continent, including *Looting Africa*, *Against Global Apartheid*, *The Politics of Climate Justice*, *Elite Transition*, *Zimbabwe's Plunge* and *Talk Left, Walk Right*.

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Bruce Rich is an attorney and author who has worked for many years with major US environmental organisations on international development and finance issues, including testimony in numerous US congressional hearings on the World Bank and other multilateral development banks. His 2013 book, *Foreclosing the Future: The World Bank and the Politics of Environmental Destruction*, examines the World Bank Group's environmental and social track record over two decades.

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Fabrina Furtado is researcher at the Federal Rural University of Rio de Janeiro (UFRRJ) Group for the Study of Social Change, Agrobusiness and Public Policy (GEMAP) and the Laboratory on the State, Work, Land and Nature of the Federal University of Rio de Janeiro. Her research areas include climate change, public policy and environmental finances in Brazil. Fabrina has extensive experience in environmental policy, urban and regional planning, and was Secretary of the Brazilian Network of Multilateral Financial Institutions and Jubilee South.

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
